In Aboriginal astronomy the origin of the universe goes back to a time called the Dreaming. It is a remarkable concept which Spencer and Gillen immortalized as the "dreamtime" or "alcheringa" of the Arunta or Aranda tribe of central Australia (Spencer and Gillen 1889).

This is a part of one of the most recognizable constellations, which is known in Western astronomy as Orion, though the Australian Aboriginal people perceive it as a canoe. The three stars in a row known as 'Orion's Belt' form the middle of the canoe, whilst the stars Betelgeuse and Rigel are its bow and stern respectively.
