Its development marked a shift among health care professionals, who had until then viewed depression from a psychodynamic perspective, instead of it being rooted in the patient's own thoughts.

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The Beck Anxiety Inventory (BAI) (Beck, Epstein, Brown, & Steer, 1988; Beck & Steer, 1993) is a 21-item scale developed to assess the severity of anxiety symptoms. Respondents are asked to rate each item on a 4-point scale ranging from 0 (not at all) to 3 (severely, can barely stand it).
