So to recap, the first step to becoming a mountain guide is to gain the proper climbing and/or backcountry skiing experience. If you are just starting out, this could take many years. The second step is to take a WFR course and at least one professional guide's training course from the AMGA or other reputable organization.

IFMGA means International Federated Mountain Guides Associations and is the english translation of Union Internationale des Associations de Guide de Montagne (UIAGM). IFMGA guides are given a pin, and a card, identifying them as a licensed guide. The process of obtaining IFMGA credentials can cost upwards of \$30,000 and takes about 5 years.

My experience with becoming a ski guide was probably pretty different than Newsome's. Originally, for a snowboarder to pass the Ski Guide certification, they had to ski to pass the ski skills test. Over the past five years, the ACMG accepted the splitboard as a tool. You can now go through the entire process on your splitboard.
