Catastrophic Brain Injury Guidelines Consider obtaining a critical care consult if not already involved in patient care Maintain SBP >90 (MAP>60) 1. Consider invasive hemodynamic monitoring 2. Adequate hydration: Ensure adequate hydration to maintain euvoolemia 3.

Catastrophic defined for this purpose as brain injury that is expected to result in a non-survivable neurological injury as determined by Neurosurgery, Trauma or ICU services after appropriate diagnostic studies and clinical examination Purpose of the guidelines To support the patient in order to allow time for family to gather at the bedside

Maintain SBP > 100 (MAP > 60) a. Consider invasive hemodynamic monitoring b. Ensure adequate hydration to maintain euvoolemia

Catastrophic Brain Injury Guidelines - Iowa Donor Network

A patient who sustains catastrophic or devastating brain injuries requires intensive monitoring and treatment, typically in an intensive care setting. Recommended treatment guidelines include: Maintain systolic blood pressure (SBP) greater than 100 mmHg or mean arterial pressure greater than 60 mmHg. Treat Diabetes Insipidus to prevent intravascular fluid depletion.

We then developed brain injury guidelines (BIG) based on the individual patient's need for observation or hospitalization, RHCT, or neurosurgical consultation. Results: A total of 1,232 patients had an abnormal head CT finding. In the BIG 1 category, no patients worsened clinically or radiographically or required any intervention.

Catastrophic Brain Injury Guidelines These guidelines are to preserve organ function in the neurologically-devastated patient. Organ donation should not be mentioned to the patient's family. LifeNet Health will consult with the healthcare team before discussing donation options with the family. Maintain SBP>100 (MAP>60)

An organ procurement organization (OPO) and a level I trauma center developed catastrophic brain injury guidelines (CBIGs) to assist in the care of severely brain-injured adult patients before brain death. The CBIGs provided a set of clinical guidelines to maintain patient stability and optimize opportunity for organ donation.

Impact of Catastrophic Brain Injury Guidelines on Donor ...

An injury or disease is a catastrophic brain injury or disease if the injury or disease results in an impairment of cognitive, physical or psychosocial functions and it results in: (a) one or more of the following: (i) a period of post traumatic amnesia of at least 7 days; (ii) a significant brain imaging abnormality;

Military Rehabilitation and Compensation (Catastrophic ...

The sensory consequences of the brain injury, e.g. loss of taste and smell, or blindness or deficits in vision, dizziness and loss of balance; The loss of Bulbar function. Tongue and throat muscles are necessary for speech and swallowing and symptoms here can be due to motor disturbance.

In order to be deemed Catastrophically Impaired, the auto insurer requires the completion of a form called an OCF-19, Application for Determination of Catastrophic Impairment. This form is available here. A physician or, in the case of a traumatic brain injury, a neuropsychologist, must complete this form and send it to the auto insurer.
