Chapter 7: Research design. As stated in the introduction, the research design adopted in this inquiry was primarily influenced by Guba and Lincoln's (1985) conception of Naturalistic Inquiry, which they later acknowledged was a form of Constructivism (Guba and Lincoln, 1998), and to a lesser extent Charmaz's (2006) constructivist conception of Grounded Theory.
