But el-Behnesa was once the site of Oxyrhynchus, a flourishing Graeco- Roman city named after the sharp-nosed oxyrhynchus fish, on the western edge of the Nile valley some 50 miles south of the Fayum region. Grenfell and Hunt had discovered 'a wealth of garbage', writes Parsons, 'a unique dustbin of vanished lives'.
