Cognitive psychology assumes that a mediational process occurs between stimulus/input and response/output. The mediational (i.e., mental) event could be memory, perception, attentionor problem solving, etc. These are known as mediational processes because they mediate (i.e., go-between) between the stimulus and the response.
