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### Communicable Disease Surveillance Case Definitions

A surveillance case definition is a set of uniform criteria used to define a disease for public health surveillance. Surveillance case definitions enable public health officials to classify and count cases consistently across reporting jurisdictions. Surveillance case definitions are not intended to be used by healthcare providers for making a clinical diagnosis or determining how to meet an individual patient's health needs.

In October 1990, in collaboration with CSTE, CDC published Case Definitions for Public Health Surveillance (4), which, for the first time, provided uniform criteria for reporting cases to increase the specificity of reporting and improve the comparability of diseases reported from different geographic areas.

## **Case Definitions for Communicable Diseases under National ...**

To protect Americans from serious disease, the National Notifiable Diseases Surveillance System (NNDSS) helps public health monitor, control, and prevent about 120 diseases. These diseases are important to monitor nationwide and include infectious diseases such as Zika, foodborne outbreaks such as E. coli, and noninfectious conditions such as lead poisoning.

## **Australian national notifiable diseases and case definitions**

The goals of SSS are to conduct and coordinate statewide surveillance of reported communicable diseases in California, maintain a high level of data accuracy and quality, manage and analyze surveillance data to monitor disease burden and to assist in the development of public health policies, and conduct research related to surveillance of communicable diseases.

## **Surveillance and Statistics Section**

The case definition for the majority of the diseases reported through the surveillance system included clinical criteria, laboratory-confirmation, and restrictions by person, place, and time. The case definition for salmonellosis used for the communicable disease surveillance system is shown at right.
