Enteral feeding formulae are about 70-80% water and the remainder of the volume consists of solids that are not used as fluid by the body. Enteral tube feeds can be administered by bolus, or by intermittent or continuous infusion. Bolus feeding entails administration of 200–400 ml of feed down a feeding tube over 15–60 minutes at regular intervals. The technique may cause bloating and diarrhoea and bolus delivery into the jejunum can cause a “dumping” type syndrome and should therefore be avoided (see section 10.4).

Within these guidelines enteral nutrition is defined as the delivery of nutrition support into the gastrointestinal tract (GIT) and can include oral nutrition support and enteral tube feeding. Enteral nutrition is used to support a person in meeting their nutritional requirements when their medical condition prevents them from maintaining adequate hydration and nutrition through oral diet alone.

The Guidelines provide guidance on the management of both adult and paediatric patients requiring Home Enteral Nutrition (HEN). 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- Tube feeding can be given in 3 different ways – using a pump, using gravity drip or using a syringe.
- A pump is used for continuous or intermittent feeds where the formula is given without stopping over 8-24 hours.
- A gravity drip is used to give larger amounts of formula over a shorter period of time usually 4 to 6 times each day.
