In doing so, ENA recognizes the role of the American Nurses Association (ANA) in defining the scope of practice for the nursing profession as a whole.

In Europe, it is ultimately the healthcare system stakeholders who determine the scope of practice for nurses working in emergency departments (EDs) 2. In the Nordic countries, hospitals and management teams typically employ registered nurses (RNs) alongside preregistration nursing students or postbasic nurse specialists (NSs).

Scope of Practice for Advanced Practice Registered Nurses ...

Emergency nursing is a speciality, involving nursing care for patients of all ages in the emergency and/or critical phase of their illness or injury, focusing on the level of severity and time-critical interventions (ENSSA, 2010) with or without advanced technology.

COMPETENCIES FOR EMERGENCY NURSING

In addition to helping patients through direct patient care, the scope of practice for clinical nurse specialists includes diagnosing and treating illnesses, injuries, and disabilities. Clinical nurse

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specialists also serve as expert consultants who lend their expertise to improve healthcare delivery within individual facilities, hospital systems, and integrated health systems.

Clinical nurse specialists are advanced practice registered nurses who have graduate preparation (Master's or Doctorate) in nursing. Like other advanced practice registered nurses, they are trained in physiology, pharmacology and physical assessment in addition to their particular areas of specialty.
