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3 Ways to Cite in Word - wikiHow

When a word or phrase is used as a word (i.e., not used functionally but referred to as the word or term itself), it is either italicized or enclosed in quotation marks. A translation of a foreign word or phrase (in italics) should be enclosed in quotation marks or parentheses.

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Put your cursor at the end of the text you want to cite. Go to References > Insert Citation, and choose the source you are citing. To add details, like page numbers if you're citing a book, select Citation Options, and then Edit Citation.

Creating Sources and Adding Citations To Your Text When you're working on any Word document, place your cursor where you want the citation to be placed. Switch to the "References" tab on the Ribbon, and then click the "Insert Citation" button.

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Use parentheses to make an in-text citation. Simply write the term you've defined in quotation marks, and place parentheses around it. Note that you should capitalize the first letter of the term. A basic parenthetical citation would be: ("Onomatopoeia").

If the author is unknown, the first few words of the reference should be used. This is usually the title of the source. If this is the title of a book, periodical, brochure or report, it should be italicized. For example: (*A guide to citation*, 2017). If this is the title of an article, chapter or web page, it should be in quotation marks. For example:

When writers insert or alter words in a direct quotation, square brackets— []—are placed around the change. The brackets, always used in pairs, enclose words intended to clarify meaning, provide a brief explanation, or to help integrate the quote into the writer's sentence.

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To cite a dictionary definition in APA Style, start with the author of the dictionary (usually an organization), followed by the publication year, the word you're citing, the dictionary name, the publisher (if not already listed as author), and the URL. Explore the format with the buttons below. Table of contents.

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The exact formatting requirements for long quotations differ depending on the citation style. In general, however, if you are quoting more than 3 lines of material, you should do the following: change the font to one noticeably smaller (in a document that is mostly 12 point font, you should use a 10 point font, for example)

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Cite the dictionary or textbook from which you took the definition at the end of the sentence if you are using in-text citations. The first time you refer to this source, use the full title followed by the abbreviation. After that first reference, you can simply use the abbreviation.

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
