Tolstoy was born at Yasnaya Polyana, a family estate 12 kilometres (7.5 mi) southwest of Tula, Russia, and 200 kilometres (120 mi) south of Moscow.He was the fourth of five children of Count Nikolai Ilyich Tolstoy (1794-1837), a veteran of the Patriotic War of 1812, and Countess Mariya Tolstaya (née Volkonskaya; 1790-1830).His mother died when he was two and his father when he was nine.

Not only is it free, but the short story format is a little less intimidating than starting with War and Peace or Anna Karenina (which I have started too many times to count!).
