NONODONTOGENIC OROFACIAL PAIN. Dental symptoms may be referred from nondental structures. Referring structures may include aphthous ulcers, herpetic infection of the gums, and the oral mucosa. Orofacial pain also can be caused by pathology in the skin, sinuses, the TMJ, ears, and vasculature. Acute swelling of the parotid, submandibular, and sublingual salivary glands may be due to inflammation or obstruction of salivary flow.
