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Covid 19 Parenting

Parentification is the process of role reversal whereby a child is obliged to act as parent to their own parent or sibling. In extreme cases, the child is used to fill the void of the alienating parent's emotional life.. Two distinct types of parentification have been identified technically: instrumental parentification and emotional parentification.

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
