CONCLUSIONS: Sustained RTW for long-term sick-listed employees can be achieved by focusing on the influenceable promoting factors for RTW. They report long-term unmet needs for rehabilitation of up to 8 years after a stroke [6-10]. To develop high-quality healthcare for stroke survivors it is essential to have a common understanding of the needs, experiences, and priorities of those living with the results of stroke [2, 11,12].
