Merton's Strain Theory of Deviance Argues that crime is a result of people being socialised into expecting success but not achieving this success due to limited opportunities. Strain Theory argues that crime occurs when there aren't enough legitimate opportunities for people to achieve the normal success goals of a society.

Merton's theory of anomie is a borrowing but essentially different from that of Durkheim. It is a more elaborate formulation of a theory that applies to a society like USA, where people believe in and are committed to the pursuit of some desirable ends (e.g., the "American Dream" - freedom, wealth, status, etc.).

Robert Merton originated what has come to be termed the Strain Theory in Criminology. He distinguishes between the institutionalised goals of a society and its cultural means which a "social structure defines, regulates, and controls the acceptable modes of achieving these goals" (Merton, p68).

Robert K Merton argued that a society may be set up in a way that promotes too much deviance. He believed that when socially accepted goals and social norms place pressure on individual to conform, they force the person to opt to work within the societally defined structure or be a member of deviant social group in attempt to achieve those goals.

The basic idea of Robert K. Merton's anomie theory is that most people strive to achieve culturally recognized goals. A state of anomie develops when access to these goals is blocked to entire groups of people or individuals. The result is a deviant behaviour characterized by rebellion, retreat, ritualism, innovation, and/or conformity.
