A rubric is a scoring guide used to assess performance against a set of criteria. At a minimum, it is a list of the components you are looking for when you evaluate an assignment. At its most advanced, it is a tool that divides an assignment into its component parts, and provides explicit expectations of acceptable and unacceptable levels of performance for each component.

### Developing a Scoring Criteria (Rubrics) - Gallaudet University

The following basic elementary scoring rubrics provide guidelines to evaluate assignments using the following criteria: 4- Meaning the students' work is Exemplary (Strong). He/she goes beyond what is expected of them to complete the assignment. 3- Meaning the students' work is good (Acceptable).

Well crafted rubrics help teachers define learning targets so that they can plan instruction more effectively, be more consistent in scoring student work, and be more systematic in reporting student progress.
