What Is a Mezuzah? Mezuzah : (Lit. "doorpost"): A small parchment scroll upon which the Hebrew words of the Shema are handwritten by a scribe. Mezuzah scrolls are rolled up and affixed to the doorposts of Jewish homes, designating the home as Jewish and reminding those who live there of their connection to G-d and their heritage.

A mezuzah is a piece of parchment called a klaf contained in a decorative case and inscribed with specific Hebrew verses from the Torah. The commandment to place a mezuzah on the doorpost is derived from a passage in the Book of Deuteronomy commonly known as the Shema. In this passage, G-d commands the Jewish people to keep His words constantly in mind and heart by (among other things) writing them on the doorposts of their houses.

A mezuzah is a small box that is placed on the right doorpost of Jewish homes. Inside the box is a parchment scroll with verses from the Torah inscribed on it, including the Shema prayer (Deuteronomy 6:4-9, 11:13-21).

During its recitation in the synagogue, Orthodox Jews pronounce each word very carefully and cover their eyes with their right

Place the mezuzah on the right side of the doorpost as you enter the main room (e.g., on the right side of the door as you enter your home, on the right side of the door as you enter a bedroom, etc.). Place the mezuzah on the upper one-third of the doorpost. Ashkenazim place the mezuzah at a slant toward the main room.

Definition of the Mezuzah and How to Use It

The mezuzah, which is placed on doorways in Jewish homes, holds a piece of parchment containing two selections of verses (Deuteronomy 6:4-9 and Deuteronomy 11:13-21). This is the Shema prayer, which expresses the unity of G-d.
