When the parents or preschool raises concerns about developmental delay, paediatricians and primary care physicians are the first points of contact for parents seeking reassurance or further assessment. Therefore, primary care physicians need to have a systematic approach when evaluating a child for development, including taking a developmental history, conducting a developmental assessment and being aware of the red flags that would warrant further specialist referrals when necessary.

During a well baby examination of a 6-week-old infant, the primary care pediatric nurse practitioner notes poor weight gain, acrocyanosis of the hands and feet, and a respiratory rate of 60 breaths per minute. Oxygen saturation on room air is 93%.

During a well child assessment the primary care pediatric ...

The Bright Futures/American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) developed a set of comprehensive health guidelines for well-child care, known as the "periodicity schedule." It is a schedule of screenings and assessments recommended at each well-child visit from infancy through adolescence.

A positive screening result should be followed by a thorough assessment done by a trained provider. A more detailed evaluation will show whether the child needs treatment and early developmental intervention services. Medical examinations can identify whether the problems are related to underlying medical conditions that need to be treated.

When you take your child to a well visit, your doctor or nurse will also do developmental monitoring. The doctor or nurse might ask you questions about your child's development or will talk and play with your child to see if he or she is developing and meeting milestones.

Choices for your child's care include your primary care physician (family practice doctor), or a pediatrician. During these well-child visits your child's doctor will give any vaccines that are due, check your child's growth and development, and test vision and hearing starting at age 4.

Childhood is a time of rapid growth and change. Children have more well-child visits when they are younger. This is because development is faster during these years. Each visit includes a complete physical exam. At this exam, the health care provider will check the child's growth and development in order to find or prevent problems.
